a) He President Mr. S. V. Kadam, took brief overview on the activities and developments took place during the financial year 2022-23. He expressed satisfaction on the association's workings during the year in spite of the challenges.

He appealed all members to come forward for active participation in the affairs of the association, appealing them to take responsibilities and even the positions of office bearers who are separating due to their retirements.

Subject 7: To appoint the Auditors and to fix their remunerations for next year (2023-24).

M/s. A. T. Upadhye & Co. an auditor firm located at Panvel is hereby appointed as an statutory auditor for the financial year 2023-24 on remuneration of Rs. 27,500/- which is same as of last year.

Subject 8: Briefing along with overview on the school by the school committee chairman.

School Committee Chairman Mr. Sandip Shirke, briefed the AGM on the school activities, recent developments and the fees collections status, along with the status on fees refund from the government on account of RTE provisions. He also briefed about the financial status of the school and how effortful and strategic decisions, the school has regained the financial comfort.

He also updated the AGM about the retrofitting works along with the painting of the entire school building completed recently. In spite of it, he pointed out towards the construction status and the life of the building considering the original building having constructed during early nineties and extended or annexed on the time gap as under, highlighted the need for being ready to reconstructing in due course of the years.

1994 - Ground Floor

2002 - Horizontal and vertical extension on 1st floor.

2005 - Annexed 2 staircases due to the requirement & fire exits.

2011-12 - Vertical extension of one additional floor and 3rd floor by metal shed structure.

2021 - Renewal of shed structure having found undesirable and quite unsafe for the building

The AGM unanimously granted the in principal approval and go ahead for the new additional building on vacant plot no P-12 admeasuring around 2000 sqmtr. Mr Shirke to submit the detailed proposal on the same and to get it reviewed and approved by the Managing Committee.

Subject 9: to update the status on byelaws amendment.

It was informed to the AGM that the process of byelaws amendments is in process and expected to be approved and registered by the charity commissionarate by end of this quarter.

Subject 10: To update on our applications for school permission till 12th Std.

It is informed to the AGM that our application is held by the education authority for certain protocol of security deposit of Rs. 5,00,000/- on combined names of the applicant and the District Education Officer. This requirement seems to be outdated since the banks are not issuing such FD certificates.

To overcome this issue by personnel visit to the District Education Department and having them expressed helpless we have worked out a solution of putting suitable remarks by the banks on the said FD certificate having it assigned to the District Education authority as a bank guaranty.

This process we likely completed soon and submission of the same on the portal the permission process will be accelerated.

Subject 11: Review on MIDC's move of allotting the plots for bio-metrical waste dumping & processing.

The President in his speech highlighted before the AGM a serious threat of shifting of biomedical waste processing and dumping to Patalganga MIDC area. He categorically expressed that though this may cause immediate harm to the industries involved in pharmaceuticals, food processing and manufacturing including warehousing the overall impact will be on rest of the industries even a livelihood of the area since it may cause air pollution, water pollution and the spread of bad orders in the atmosphere that would even challenge retention of skilled employees apart from health challenges to the villagers as well as the employees.

While concluding the speech, he appealed the members to review these aspects seriously and proposed to come forward for opposing these move. He suggested to form a core committee to initiate and monitor required steps to be taken in this regard including approaching judiciaries in a required manner.

The AGM granted in principal nod to go for the legal fight if required and following resolution is passed
